Balliol is less than five minutes from the Ashmolean Museum, Radcliffe Square, and the city's shopping districts.



St Catherine's College

Known affectionately as 'St Catz', this is Oxford's youngest college, founded in 1962 by Allan Bullock. Swathes of glass overlook the traditional quadrangle, and it is just a short walk from the city centre.

St Catherine's boasts its own impressive alumni, including Benazir Bhutto (late Prime Minister of Pakistan), oarsman Matthew Pinsent, and novelist Joseph Heller.

St Hugh's College


St Hugh's was founded by Elizabeth Wordsworth (William's great niece), who wanted to open up an Oxford education to women.

Today, the college is open to all, but is proud of its history. Alumni include suffragette Emily Davison, former UK Prime Minister Theresa May, and the writer Joanna Trollope. St Hugh's sits close to the University Parks and the Pitt Rivers Museum.

Merton College

Live the life of an undergraduate in one of Oxford's oldest colleges this summer. Merton was founded in 1264, and the college's Mob Quad and Library are respectively the oldest quadrangle and library in the University of Oxford.

Located right in the heart of Oxford city centre, just off the High Street, Merton is perfectly located for shopping, cafés and sightseeing.
